


The short-list for Finsia's Pinnacle Awards has been announced, which includes most outstanding industry contribution, most outstanding young professional and most outstanding future leader.

A panel of senior Financial Services Institute of Australasia (FINSIA) membesr has released its short-list of nominees across five categories from almost 300 nominations.
